



On Saturday, 15 February 2003, the Society will launch a new joint publication with the Locus Placenames Project which is based in the Department of Early and Medieval Irish at University College, Cork. The publication is the first fascicle of a new Dictionary of Gaelic Placenames, the first since Fr Hogan's *Onomasticon Goedelicum* (1910), which until now has remained the standard reference work on the subject.

The launch will take place at the Irish Writers' Centre/Áras na Scríbhneoirí, 19 Parnell Square, Dublin 1, at 3.00 p.m.

New Publication -Foilseachán nua

The most recent publication in the ITS Subsidiary Publications Series, *'Beatha Aodha Ruaidh': The Life of Red Hugh O'Donnell, Historical & Literary Contexts* (SS 12), edited by Pádraig Ó Riain, was launched at the 4th ITS/UCC Seminar on 9 November 2002. The publication, which contains the proceedings of the 3rd ITS/UCC Seminar, focuses on the text which forms volumes 42 and 45 of the Society's Main Series.

'Beatha Aodha Ruaidh': The Life of Red Hugh O'Donnell, Historical & Literary Contexts consists of six chapters:

- 'The Real Red Hugh', by Hiram Morgan
- 'The Beatha in the Context of the Literature of the Renaissance', by Mícheál Mac Craith
- 'The Language of the Beatha', by Damian McManus

- 'Politics and Religion in the Poetry of Fearghal Óg Mac an Bhaird and Eoghan Ruadh Mac an Bhaird', by Marc Caball
- 'Paul Walsh as Editor and Explicator of Beatha Aodha Ruaidh', by Nollaig Ó Muraíle
- 'Irish Records of the Nine Years' War: A Brief Survey, with Particular Notice of the Relationship between Beatha Aodha Ruaidh Uí Dhomhnaill and the Annals of the Four Masters', by Pádraig A Breatnach

The publication also contains a foreword by Pádraig Ó Riain, a bibliography, and a general index.

This new volume joins eleven other publications in the Society's Subsidiary Series. The vast majority of these are related to a text in the Society's Main Series, noting the main developments in the field since the original publication, and conveying an indication of the text's status and significance within its particular genre.

They will be valuable to Libraries and to individuals who possess the original volumes, as well as being separately available to students and the interested reader.
